

## Guide: Science Communication on Wikipedia

« The great but underappreciated advantage of Wikipedia is that it allows researchers to communicate research results and scientific expertise in exactly the place where people look for it: in topical Wikipedia articles. »<sup>1</sup>

### I) Tips before you start

1. Sign up to Wikipedia: Editing without logging in is possible but logged in users have more rights. Create an account [here](#) (in 2 min).
2. Start out by editing other articles before writing a new article. Learn from other Wikipedians.
3. Use the sandbox tool for some training before you start. The content in your sandbox will not be published in the encyclopedia. You find the sandbox tool here (if logged in):



4. Don't worry if you don't get everything right in the beginning or if your article is not complete yet. Wikipedia is a collaborative platform: other Wikipedians will improve and complete your articles.
5. If you write a new article, start by checking similar articles to learn from them and copy the style.

### II) Writing style on Wikipedia (for scientific information)

1. Be concise; make sure your sections aren't too long.
2. Readers should not have to be well-versed in a topic to understand a Wikipedia article.
3. Do not use jargon or scientific language.
4. Don't do "original research" on Wikipedia: use secondary sources, "don't analyze, evaluate, interpret, or synthesize material".
5. Articles should be written on the assumption that the reader will not or cannot follow the blue links (references to other articles)
6. If possible: use (reliable!) online sources, so other users can check them.

### III) Checklist for new articles:

### ***Before you start***

1. Check existing articles: is your topic already on Wikipedia? Maybe under a different name?
2. Notability: check if your topic is notable enough for Wikipedia? (see helpful links)
3. Check if there is a manual of style (MOS) for your topic (e.g., maths, music, linguistics, biographies etc.). A manual of style contains guidelines for language, style and structure in your specific field.
4. Check if there is a WikiProject for your subject.

### ***During editing***

4. Make sure your article is linked to other articles: insert blue links.
5. Add categories for your article at the bottom of the article.
6. Check language and structure (see below)
7. Optional: Add an image from Wikimedia Commons (or upload one yourself if you have the copyright.)
8. Final check: citations, spelling, consistency etc.
